GRAD Tickets: Convocation tickets are free of charge and each grad will receive one graduate ticket and 4 family tickets. The reception tickets are \$15.00 per person and will be sold in May. Anyone (including the graduate) planning to eat must purchase a ticket.

Who is Eligible to attend Graduation 2010?

The graduating student must have completed a minimum of 100 credits by the end of June 2009 in order to participate in the graduation activities. Failure to meet this requirement will mean the student will be removed from the graduation list.

How does the student earn an Alberta High School Diploma?

Each student must satisfy the course/credit requirements listed below:

1. Earn a minimum of 100 credits,
2. Meet the standards and complete the following courses:
 - minimum of 10 credits in math,
 - minimum of 10 credits in science, biology, chemistry or physics.
3. Meet the standards and complete the following:
 - PE 10, CALM 20, 10 credits from CTS, or Fine Arts, or a Second Language, 10 credits from any 30 level courses (includes locally developed/acquired and authorized courses), in addition to the English and Social Studies 30 courses.



Parents need to understand.....

CTS courses are modular based so enrolling in a "30 section" does not guarantee that the modules your child chooses to complete will be 30 level modules and/or that they will automatically receive five credits. Completion of three modules = 3 credits; four modules = 4 credits and so on. Depending on individual student's work ethic, some could be awarded up to 10 credits/CTS

Please be aware that the outlined events are the only school sanctioned graduation events.
